



THE EXECUTIVE SESSION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS WAS HELD AT 8:00 A.M. PRESENT WERE COMMISSIONER PHILLIP MARSHALL, COMMISSIONER TODD EWEN, COMMISSIONER RICK ROBERTS, ATTORNEY APRIL GELTMAKER, AND AUDITOR KYRA STEPHENSON. THE UNDERSIGNED CERTIFY THAT THE ONLY ITEMS DISCUSSED WERE I.C. 5-14-1.5-6.1(b)(2)(B) INITIATION OF LITIGATION OR LITIGATION THAT IS EITHER PENDING OR HAS BEEN THREATENED SPECIFICALLY IN WRITING, I.C. 5-14-1.5-6.1-(9)

THE MEETING WAS OPENED WITH THE PLEDGE TO THE FLAG BY COMMISSIONER ROBERTS FOLLOWED BY A PRAYER LED BY COMMISSIONER EWEN.

COMMISSIONER EWEN MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE CLAIMS, PAYROLL, AND MINUTES. THE MOTION WAS SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER ROBERTS. MOTION PASSED.

BRIDGE DEDICATION DISCUSSION

THE COMMISSIONERS ARE WORKING WITH ANDREW BUSH IN THE VETERANS AFFAIRS OFFICE ON DEDICATING BRIDGE 88-00238 LOCATED ON SOUTH MAIN STREET IN CITY OF SALEM. WALMART WILL BE DONATING SUPPLIES AND DECORATIONS FOR THE DEDICATION. TEMPLE AND TEMPLE WILL PROVIDE A TRAILER TO BE USED FOR A STAGE FOR THE SPEAKERS. THERE WILL BE REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE STATE THAT WILL ATTEND. MR. BUSH HAS WORKED WITH THE COMMISSIONERS AND AGREED THEY WOULD LIKE TO NAME THE BRIDGE, WASHINGTON COUNTY VETERANS MEMORIAL BRIDGE. ATTORNEY GELTMAKER WILL PREPARE THE RESOLUTION NEEDED TO BE PRESENTED TO THE STATE FOR APPROVAL. COMMISSIONER ROBERTS MADE A MOTION TO NAME THE WASHINGTON COUNTY VETERANS MEMORIAL BRIDGE AND MOVE FORWARD WITH THE RESOLUTION. MOTION WAS SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER EWEN. MOTION PASSED.

THE DEDICATION WILL BE HELD ON VETERANS DAY, NOVEMBER 11, 2024. MR BUSH WILL ATTEND THE NEXT COMMISSIONER MEETING ON AUGUST 20, 2024 FOR FURTHER DISCUSSION AND PLANNING.

MR. BUSH INQUIRED ABOUT THE COUNTIES CONTRIBUTION OF ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS FOR VETERAN'S MARKERS. THE ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS HAS ALWAYS BEEN A ONE-TIME PAYMENT BUT MR. BUSH WOULD LIKE TO INCREASE THAT AND ALLOW THE ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS TO BE PAID AGAIN IF A MARKER IS DAMAGED. COMMISSIONER EWEN INSTRUCTED MR. BUSH TO TALK WITH THE COUNCIL ABOUT THIS DURING THE UPCOMING BUDGET HEARINGS.

HEALTH INSURANCE ENROLLMENT

EMPLOYEE HEALTH INSURANCE RENEWAL WILL BEGIN AUGUST 12, 2024. ZACK RICHARDS HAS QUOTED OUT THE HEALTH INSURANCE AND RECEIVED A FEW OPTIONS. THE CURRENT PLAN THE COUNTY HAS INCREASED FROM \$1,074,952.20 TO \$1,270,325.40 BUT UPON REVIEW, SEEMED OFFER THE BEST COVERAGE FOR THE EMPLOYEES. COMMISSIONER EWEN MADE A MOTION TO MOVE FORWARD WITH KEEPING THE INSURANCE WITH THE CURRENT CARRIER. MOTION WAS SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER ROBERTS. MOTION PASSED.

EVAN BRIDGEWATER – 911 ADDRESS COMPLAINT

MR BRIDGEWATER CALLED 911 IN JULY FOR A HEALTH PROBLEM FOR HIS WIFE. WHEN THE CALL WAS DISPATCHED TO HIS RESIDENCE ON COUNTY LINE ROAD, IT SENT EMS CREWS TOWARD PALMYRA. THE COUNTY HAS FOUR COUNTY LINE ROADS WHICH MAKES IT DIFFICULT TO KNOW WHICH COUNTY LINE ROAD TO RESPOND TOO. EMS DID RESPOND TO MR BRIDGEWATER'S RESIDENTS AFTER THE CALL WAS CLEARED UP BY MR BRIDGEWATER CLARIFYING IT WAS SCOTT COUNTY LINE ROAD. MR BRIDGEWATER WOULD LIKE THE COMMISSIONERS TO WORK ON A PLAN TO POSSIBLY RENAME THE COUNTY LINE ROADS SO IT IS MORE EASILY KNOWN WHERE EMS, FIRE, OR SHERIFF NEEDS TO BE DISPATCHED TO. COMMISSIONER MARSHALL ASSURED MR BRIDGEWATER HE WOULD WORK WITH 911 DIRECTOR KELLY SARGENT AND SHERIFF MILLER TO TRY TO COME UP A SOLUTION.


GENERATOR MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT

A PLEDGE TO THE FLAG WAS LED BY COMMISSIONER ROBERTS FOLLOWED BY A PRAYER
BY COMMISSIONER EWEN.


THE HEALTH INSURANCE COST INCREASED THE FOLLOWING AMOUNTS:

- \$1,000 DEDUCTIBLE EMPLOYEE ONLY \$98.17 TO \$109.99
- EMPLOYEE + CHILD \$453.77 TO \$529.40
- \$3,200 DEDUCTIBLE EMPLOYEE ONLY \$24.32 TO \$31.46
- EMPLOYEE + CHILD \$322.97 TO \$382.57


THE COMMISSIONERS ALONG WITH ZACK RICHARDS FROM KNAPP MILLER BROWN
DISCUSSED WHETHER THE COUNTY COULD ABSORB THE EXTRA COST OR IF THE
EMPLOYEE WOULD NEED TO CONTRIBUTE MORE. AFTER SOME DISCUSSION, IT WAS
MENTIONED THE COUNTY ALREADY ABSORBS APPROXIMATELY 85% OF THE COST OF
HEALTH INSURANCE WHICH IS MORE THAN IS REQUIRED. OPEN ENROLLMENT FORMS
WERE BEING SENT OUT ON AUGUST 12, 2024 AND DUE BACK ON AUGUST 23, 2024 BY
4:00 P.M. COMMISSIONER ROBERTS MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE ADDITIONAL
COST TO COME FROM THE EMPLOYEES. MOTION WAS SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER
EWEN. MOTION PASSED.
