

RECESS FOR BOARD OF FINANCE MEETING.

**BOARD OF FINANCE**

BOARD OF FINANCE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY TREASURER, NANCY COATS. THOSE IN ATTENDANCE WERE TREASURER NANCY COATS, COMMISSIONER RICK ROBERTS, COMMISSIONER TODD EWEN, COMMISSIONER PHILLIP MARSHALL, REPRESENTATIVES OF FIRST SAVINGS: DANIEL SHEPHARD, KATRINA HUMPHREY, AND DANA JULIOT.

THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO DISCUSS THE INVESTMENTS THE COUNTY HAS WITH FIRST SAVINGS.

THE ARP MONEY IS COMING DUE FOR RENEWAL OR CASH OUT. THE BOARD DISCUSSED INVESTING IT FOR ANOTHER THREE MONTHS UNTIL IT HAS TO BE SPENT BY THE END OF DECEMBER 2024. AFTER SOME DISCUSSION IT WAS DECIDED TO MOVE THE ONE MILLION DOLLARS INTO A MONEY MARKET. COMMISSIONER EWEN MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE MOVING THE ARP FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF 1 MILLION INTO A MONEY MARKET ACCOUNT. MOTION WAS SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER ROBERTS. MOTION PASSED. KATRINA AND DANIEL WILL HANDLE THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS ON THE BANKING SIDE.


THE COUNTY HAS ANOTHER CD IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2.5 MILLION THAT MATURES AT THE END OF SEPTEMBER. AFTER SOME DISCUSSION IT WAS DECIDED TO INVEST THIS MONEY INTO CD'S AS WELL. IT WAS AGREED TO INVEST \$1.25 MILLION INTO A 12-MONTH CD AND ANOTHER \$1.25 MILLION INTO ANOTHER CD FOR 24-MONTHS. COMMISSIONER ROBERTS MADE A MOTION TO GIVE TREASURER COATS THE AUTHORITY TO MOVE THE MONEY AS SHE'S SEES FIT. MOTION WAS SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER EWEN. MOTION PASSED.

WITH THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS AT HAND FOR THE BOARD OF FINANCE, COMMISSIONER EWEN MADE A MOTION TO ADJOURN THE BOARD OF FINANCE MEETING. MOTION WAS SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER ROBERTS. MOTION PASSED.

-WOULD LIKE TO HAVE A JOINT PRESENTATION OF THE ASSESSMENT SOFTWARE IN 2025 WITH THE COMMISSIONERS AND ASSESSOR.

-COUNCILMEMBER SHELL WOULD LIKE A JOINT MEETING WITH THE FAIRBOARD CONCERNING THE 30,000 IN FUNDING THE COUNTY PROVIDES.

-THE CONSENSUS OF THE COUNCIL IS TO GRANT AN 8% SALARY INCREASE UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED ABOVE.


-SOME BUDGETS WERE ADJUSTED DUE TO PROPOSED SALARY INCREASES AND RECEIVING THE 2025 INSURANCE RATES.
