
To the Board of Commissioners of Washington County, Indiana,

At the conclusion of the public hearing, the Commissioners voted unanimously to reject the proposed zoning ordinance as written and to request amendments.

Pursuant to the request of David Hoar, and in accordance with Ind. Code §36-7-4-606(g), the Commissioners hereby submit the following statements to provide guidance and reasons for rejection and request for amendment, as follows:

1. The Washington County Commissioners desire to adopt a zoning ordinance for Washington County in accordance with the comprehensive plan.
2. It is acceptable that the current ordinance presented be in limited scope so as to address the issues raised by the increase in development of confined livestock operations. No commentary was offered for additional areas of regulation at this time.
3. The Commissioners desire the point system concept, which would result in varying set-back distances, over the static set-back regulation contained in the proposed ordinance that does not take into account mitigating factors.
4. The Commissioners do not offer a comprehensive list of required point system categories but do opine that it is acceptable to include in the point system provisions that are not yet in place on the proposed operation and would require follow-up compliance action. One such example would be the proposal by the operator to plant/install a "bio-filter" which does not exist at the proposed operation.
5. Reciprocal set-backs governing the placement of private residences are not required at this time.


